## Running on Empty? You're Not Alone

If you're a parent of schoolage kids or a grandparent helping out with the daily juggle, you've probably felt it: the



relentless pace of family life. Between work, school, sports, appointments, and trying to have at least one real meal together each day, it's easy to feel like you're running on fumes. Maybe you've caught yourself saying things like, "There's just not enough time," or "I'm exhausted all the time."

We get it. And you're not the only one feeling this way.

The Bible speaks into this reality. In *Matthew 11:28*, Jesus says,

# "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Rest. Not the kind that comes from five hours of sleep or a weekend off, but the kind that settles your heart and reminds you that you don't have to do life alone.

So, what does that look like in the chaos of real life?

Here are a few practical ways to invite that kind of rest into your family rhythm:

 Embrace the "No." You don't have to say yes to everything. Every activity isn't essential. Take time this spring to look at your calendar and ask, "Is this helping my family grow closer—or just keeping us busy? "Sometimes, saying "no" is the most loving thing you can do for your kids and your own well-being.

- 2. Make room for quiet moments. Even five minutes in the morning or evening can be sacred. Take a short walk. Sip your coffee in silence. Read a verse or just breathe. It's not about being "religious"—it's about making space to reconnect with what really matters.
- 3. Invite help—and accept it. You don't have to do everything alone. Whether you're a parent trying to manage the carpool or a grandparent who feels out of the loop, let someone in. That's part of what church is about—showing up for each other.
- 4. Reclaim the dinner table. We know it's not always possible but aim for at least a few shared meals each week with no screens. Ask simple questions like, "What made you laugh today?" or "What was hard today?" You'll be surprised how much connection comes from that small shift.

Jesus never promised life would be easy. But he did promise he'd walk with us through it. At Monroe UMC, we're learning how to lean into that promise together. You're invited to join us—no perfect people required.

Because maybe you're not running on empty. Maybe you just need to pull over, take a breath, and remember—you're not in this alone.

#### **Because He Lives**

Gloria Gaither once shared the background of "Because He Lives." She stated:

When Bill and I started our family in the sixties, racial tensions were tearing the country apart. Civil rights activists had suffered, and



some had been killed. The Vietnam conflict was claiming thousands of lives, and tensions boiled over on university campuses. Many young people were growing disillusioned and "dropping out."

In this climate, Bill and I sought to write songs with lasting answers to the turmoil of the human spirit. But in the fall of 1969, several things happened to test the reality of our own convictions. We realized we were expecting another baby. Though we had always intended to have another child, we weren't planning on a baby so soon. My body hadn't quite recovered from the last pregnancy. Making matters worse, Bill contracted mononucleosis, which left him exhausted and depressed.

This combination of national turmoil and personal trouble discouraged us, and we

occasionally asked each other, "If the world is like this now, what will it be in fifteen or sixteen years for our baby? What will this child face?"

While pondering and praying about these things, we came to realize anew that our courage doesn't come from a stable world, for the world has never been stable. Jesus himself was born in the cruelest of times. No, we have babies, raise families, and risk living because the Resurrection is true!

Our baby arrived safe and sound, and we named him Benjamin, which means "most beloved son." A few weeks later "Because He Lives" was born in our hearts and poured from our souls.

Over the years this song has reassured us that our Lord's Resurrection is the central truth of life. Because He lives, we can face tomorrow. Many times since, as our children grew, our business life changed, our fortunes shifted, or our direction clouded, our family has found assurance in this very personal song.

It's "our song," but we're grateful others have loved it. too.
